### **Monitoring and Evaluation of the Global Mine Action Programme (GMAP) 2**

Itad has been retained by DFID to monitor and evaluate the Global Mine Action Programme 2 (GMAP2). We successfully delivered the M&E contract for GMAP1, providing continuous reliable and robust monitoring and evaluation services to DFID from 2016 to 2018. GMAP2 continues the work of reducing the humanitarian and development impact of landmines and explosive remnants of war (ERW). The expected results include making safe 150 km<sup>2</sup> land, enabling 800,000 people to live their lives free from the threat of mines and helping 100,000 adults and children to understand the dangers of landmines. GMAP2 will build the capacity of regional and national demining authorities based on their priorities, including improving information and risk management systems and increase the effectiveness of local management. Giorgia recently co-led the Yemen country study of the formative evaluation of GMAP 2 which looked at strategic relevance, delivery arrangements and likelihood of effectiveness of the programme in Yemen. She also contributed to a research piece that seeks to better understand the linkages between mine action and longer-term development change.

### **Evaluation of UNHCR's role as Cluster Lead Agency for the Global Protection Cluster**

Itad conducted an evaluation of UNHCR's role in leading the Global Protection Cluster (GPC), focussing on UNHCR's performance as Cluster Lead Agency (CLA) at both global and country levels. The evaluation focused on exploring how the protection clusters at country level are supported by the GPC, and what lessons can be learned by UNHCR from its role as CLA in the field. The evaluation examined the achievements and challenges of the cluster at global and field level with regard to coordination, capacity building, support to the field and mainstreaming protection, and looked at achievements against the 2012-15 GPC strategy as well as provide recommendations of relevance to the current 2016-19 strategy. Giorgia coordinated this survey in three languages (English, French and Spanish) targeted at all active protection clusters and undertook an analysis of the results that helped strengthen the evidence base.
