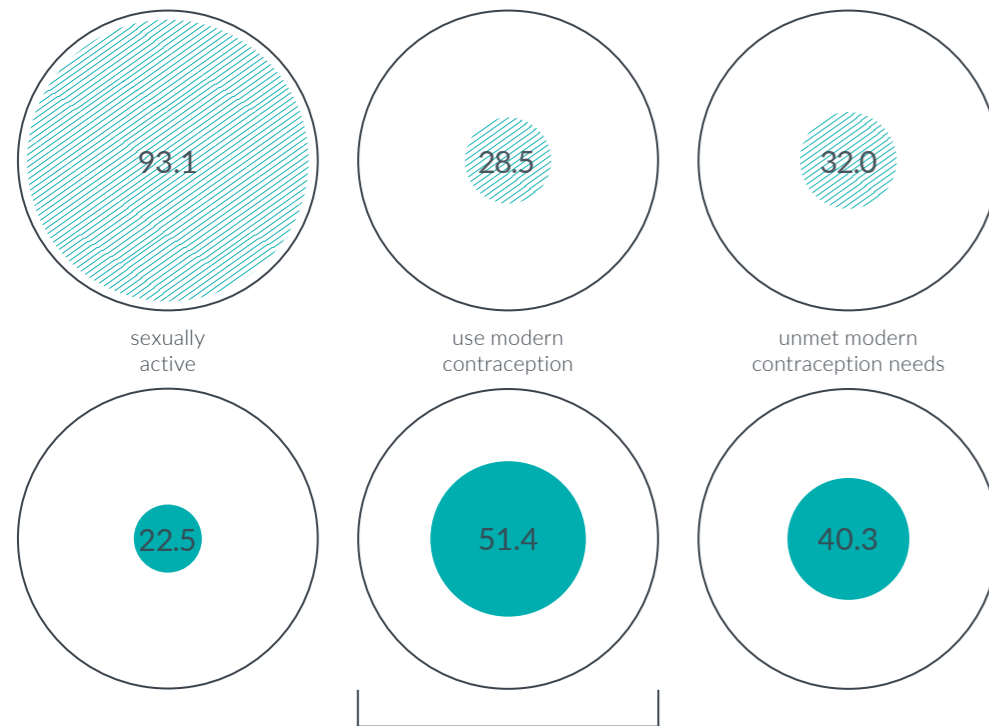


Adolescents 360 (A360) is a four-year initiative (2016-2020) to increase adolescent girls' access to and demand for modern contraception in Ethiopia, Nigeria and Tanzania. A360 is being implemented in three zones in Tanzania, four regions in the Lake Zone (Mwanza, Geita, Kagera and Tabora), three regions in the Central Zone (Arusha, Mbeya and Iringa) and three regions in the Coast Zone (Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Morogoro). As part of the evaluation of A360 in Tanzania, we sought to identify the key sexuality, fertility and family planning characteristics of the target population at baseline prior to A360 implementation in one district of one region (Ilemela, Mwanza). A360 targets both married and unmarried adolescents in Tanzania.

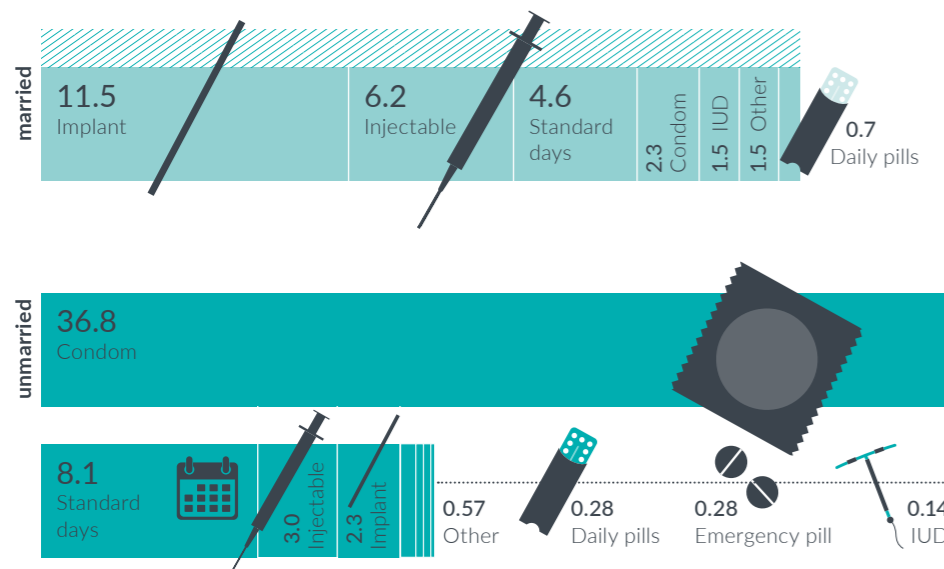

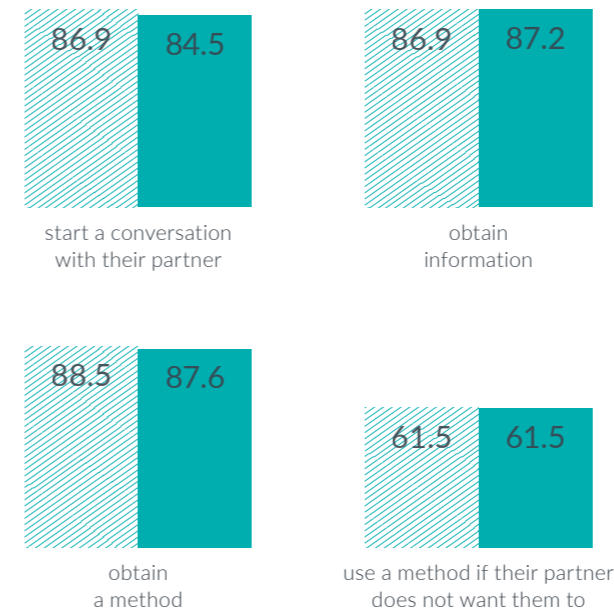

% agreed a benefit of contraception is to...



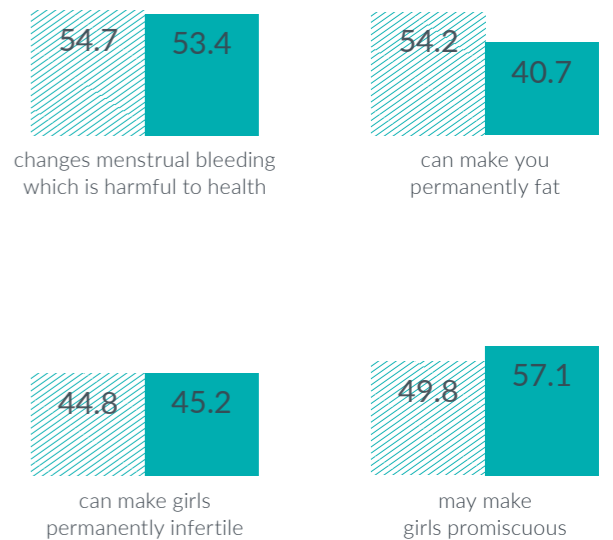
SELF-EFFICACY

Regarding contraception, % who feel able to...



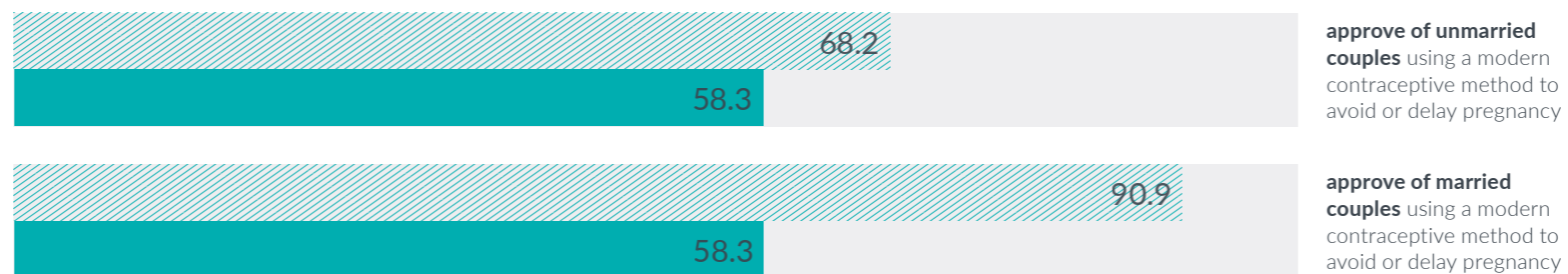
MISCONCEPTIONS

% agreed that contraception...



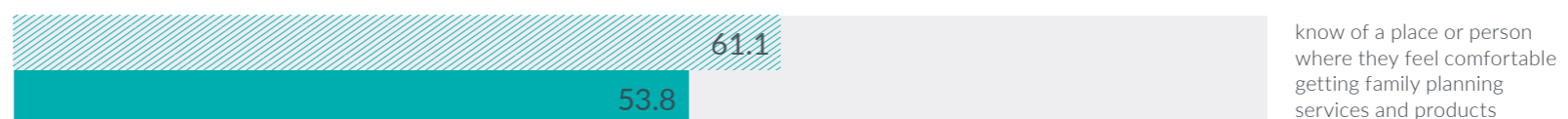
ATTITUDES
