Marco Maragno is a Consultant at Itad. He has worked on humanitarian and development projects in Africa, Asia, Europe and Latin America. Drawing on his background in anthropology and his fluency in multiple languages, he has been involved in extensive fieldwork in challenging settings, including working with refugees, internally displaced people, indigenous minorities and children.

Marco now specialises in the evaluation of health programmes. In particular, he has experience in programmes targeted at vulnerable groups and researching cross-sectoral causes for marginalisation such as gender, displacement and ethnicity. Marco holds a MSc in Anthropology and Development from The London School of Economics and Political Science and has been trained on protection frameworks for child refugees, as well as for children with additional needs and disabilities. He is also Gender Technical Lead in the Itad Human Development Practice, promoting and overseeing the application of gender mainstreaming approaches in our MEL work.

Prior to joining Itad, Marco was leading the design of M&E projects at JaRco Consulting in Ethiopia. In this position, he carried out complex field research across Ethiopia. He has previously managed the implementation of a sustainable livelihoods projects in Colombia, coordinating field teams and working together with indigenous communities on agroforestry, nutrition and water management. He also has field experience with displaced communities, having volunteered full-time in Greek refugee camps with Habibi Works and The Flying Seagull Project, in particular working closely with child refugees.

Marco is part of the core evaluation team working on Contribution Analysis to assess how far the outputs of the portfolio of country and regional grants have contributed, or will contribute, to the outcomes and impact of the overarching Fleming Fund. He is also leading data collection on a number of country case studies.

This 'social audit' assesses the extent to which poverty, inequality and other forms of social exclusion, particularly disability, are addressed in the planned outcomes and pathways to impact of GCRF programmes and other investments.

The programme is funded by CIFF and its partners Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), ELMA Philanthropies (ELMA) and Virgin Unite.

Marco project manages the evaluation of the Accelerate programme. This utilises impact and process evaluation methodology including modelling of secondary data to assess impact and cost effectiveness/cost benefit. The evaluation will generate evidence and learning that will be key to informing programmatic course correction and contribute to the wider evidence base and dialogue on the elimination of trachoma and other NTDs. Marco is also one of the core team's evaluators, providing expertise on NTD integration, and leading the Ethiopia and Zimbabwe country case studies.

#### 2020 - Present Evaluation of the Global Burden of Disease Antimicrobial Resistance (GRAM) Programme

The goal of this project is to create globally-comparable estimates of the burden of AMR/DRI for bacteriaantibacterial drug combinations that currently pose the greatest threat to public health, and to provide estimates in an interactive visualization platform to track changes over time.

The evaluation of GRAM focuses on: efficiency and effectiveness of the data gathering approach; alignment and coherence with: (a) the UK Government's other support in the area of Global Health Security, and (b) support for this agenda by other partners; data use for policy making purposes.

Marco is one of the team's main evaluators, leading one of the six country case studies and related analysis, investigating causality for policy change by the government of Mexico.

Marco is also the project's Learning Champion, being responsible for identifying opportunities for sharing insights from the evaluation to encourage learning and uptake by varied stakeholders of ASCEND.

#### 9 2015-2019 Ethiopia Country Program Evaluation and Gender Programmatic Review

This multi-sector evaluation involved studying programmes on adolescent sexual and reproductive health and rights, public health systems strengthening, nutrition, and food security.

Marco designed the research methodology, which involved conducting KIIs and FGDs, as well as an analysis of primary and secondary data on the nutritional characteristics of hydroponic fodder. Marco was also responsible for project management, including assembling field teams and acting as the main client contact.
